General guidelines for the application of awards & fellowship of the Society:

1. The application must be forwarded by the competent authority.
2. Documentary proof for each and every attribute viz. courses taught, thesis awarded to M.Sc./Ph.D. students; copy of 1st page of the thesis, research papers and attested copies of certificates must be enclosed.
3. **If a candidate has been already awarded one senior award (i.e. J.J. Chinoy Gold Medal or J.C. Bose Gold Medal) or junior award (R.D. Asana Gold Medal or R.H. Dastur Award), he/she is not eligible to apply for the award in the same category again. It means that one candidate is eligible only for one senior and junior award of the society.**
4. **One candidate can submit only one application i.e. either for award or for the fellowship**
5. The application format must be followed, as mentioned below.
6. A candidate can apply either in the "Research" or "Research + Teaching" category and advised to self assess his/her score and fill up the same in the format.
7. The candidates must mention the impact factor/NAAS Score of the journal and made self assessment of their score and fill up in the column.
8. Total number of pages of the application should be restricted to fifty, attached only relevant document and only copy of 1st page of thesis or publications may be attached.
